1. Boards and Commissions Update

b. City Council

- We have a new city attorney!

- The sale of marijuana in Brighton may be a possibility: It will be added to the upcoming ballot for city elections.

- Currently, there are 3 people running for mayor and 2 for Ward 1. The other available positions are running unopposed.

c. Parks and Recreation

- There is a proposal for the Brighton Oasis to raise their prices a little or go back to 2019 prices to make back losses.

- The main topic of discussion was the Housing Development Project. They are thinking of adding over 800 units near 144th and Chambers, and the possibility of widening the narrow road near there.
